

Polish 1st Army on 15 August 1920

These tables are taken from: *Bój Na Przedmościu Warszawy w Sierpniu 1920r.* It covers the battles in front of Warsaw in extreme detail.

As well as the unit strengths given here, it also has schematic diagrams of the key units. They can be seen on pygmywars.com.

The combat strengths for the main formations of the army are given as:

These numbers undercount combatants however.

- The infantry figure appears to be only riflemen in infantry units, so not including men in MG companies.
- Sappers, etc do not usually count as “fighting men”.
- There were Volunteer, Railway and similar units not in the formal divisions above.

While there are some small variation, the figures for “fighting men” are largely fixed by formula. To the combat strength is added:

- Six men for each HMG.
- Eight men for each gun.

I have retained the term *divizion* for the units of cavalry between a squadron and a regiment, and for what might generally be called a “Battalion” of artillery. It should not be confused with “division”.

The information is seriously conflicting for the artillery:

- The Officer, Men and MG totals do not add up to the columns above.
- The Skrzyszew Artillery Group Command is present, and was part of the group, but has no units.
- The batteries listed by gun type include two missing in the figures.

It is tempting to put the extra batteries in the Skrzyszew Group, as it appears to be a group with no guns.
