# Battle of Orël, 10-27 October 1919

# White Order of Battle

My primary source of the units involved in the Battle of Orel is I. I. Sukhov's article in Сержант (Seargent) Magazine #5 and Volkov. Note that the Soviets referred to this battle as the Orël-Kromy Operation.

The 3rd Markov Regiment was newly formed. The Black Sea Cavalry supported the brigade as independent squadrons.

The 2nd General Alekseev Regiment was recently formed. The Composite Rifle Regiment was in the rear, fighting Makhno.

The strength of this division declined rapidly during the fighting around Orël and Kromy. The strengths above are quite a lot lower than the peak numbers of the start of the battle – the Kornilov Brigade had started with over 6,000 bayonets.

This division was within weeks split into the Kornilov and Markov Divisions (the 1st, 2nd and 4th Artillery Divzions went to the Markov and the 3rd to the Kornilov).

At some time in October, Colonel A. V. Turkul' took over the 1st Regiment, to be replaced by Colonel V. G. Kharzhevskiy. The infantry regiments likely had unrecorded cavalry components or there were dispersed squadrons of a cavalry unit operating with them.

As with the 1st Division, unit strengths fell rapidly during the battle. This was soon renamed the Drozdovskiy Division. At some point afterwards the Samurskiy Regiment went to the newly formed Alekseev Division.



#### **9th Infantry Division**

Recently formed out of the Alekseevtsy and the 13th Belozersk, 14th Olonetsk and Composite Rifle Regiments, expanded with a large number of POWs.

Half was attached the 1st Division, above, while the 13th and 14th Regiments were in the Forces of the Kiev Area, in the rear.
