

Selections from Operations on the Vistula in August 1920

The location of places and geographical terms

The names are generally the Polish form, since they were in Poland in 1920 and it allows for consistency with Piłsudski's "Year 1920" unless there is a commonly recognised English name such as Warsaw and the Vistula River. However all references to "Belarus" and "Ukraine" is to the modern borders, since most people will use post-1945 maps.
